



STUDY OF TRENDS & ASSOCIATED RISKS FOR STILLBIRTH

Parents and researchers working together to better understand stillbirth risk factors.

The death of an unborn child is a devastating event which occurs over 26,000 times a year in the US and over 4.5 million times each year around the world. Approximately half of these deaths are after 28 weeks gestation (late stillbirth).

This research study has been designed to collect information from both stillbirth mothers and those who delivered living children to identify differences in their prenatal experiences and observations. While we acknowledge the pain of any pregnancy loss, this study will focus on late stillbirth (28 weeks or more gestation).

We are looking for mothers of infants - both stillborn, live-born or soon to be born to participate in this research study. You may be eligible if:

- ◆ You can speak, write and read English **AND**
- ◆ You delivered a stillborn baby in the past **OR**
- ◆ You are currently at least 28 weeks pregnant or more **OR**
- ◆ delivered your living baby in the last 3 weeks.
